THOUGHT OF THE DAY PERSONAL GROWTH - in the course of my experience at L'Arche, I have discovered four principles necessary for human growth and good accompaniment.

***The principle of reality:** to embrace things as they really are, and not to be constantly angry with them but rather to see what is positive in them. Not to be attached to preconceived ideas and especially not to prejudices and theories. To recognize in ourselves the blind spots and the defence mechanisms that stop us from seeing reality, and lead us to deny it. To love and live the present moment in the reality that is given.

***The principle of growth:** life is moving, evolving. There are things that we cannot do today because of our limitations, our youth, our fears. But tomorrow, or with time, new strengths will grow up in us. We are in the process of changing: others are changing too. We must know how to wait patiently. We must know how to befriend time.

***Finally, the principle of nourishment and the principle of finality.** The purpose of all human growth is openness to others, to God, to the world: to discover our common humanity; to work for a world where there is more communion and compassion between human beings. But each person needs to choose the right means to be well nourished in order to achieve this end. We must make good choices.
